#### Pope Francis draws attention to the true meaning of Christmas.

"The tree, with its lights", reminds us of Jesus who comes to illuminate our darkness, our existence often locked up in the shadow of sin, fear, and pain". But it also suggests the idea that, like trees we need roots, "solid foundations" to remain firm, grow and resist the winds of life. It is therefore important "to cherish the roots, in life as in faith".

The crib, "speaks to us of the birth of the Son of God who became Man to be close to each one of us".

"In its genuine poverty, the nativity scene helps us to rediscover the true richness of Christmas", a different Christmas "from the consumerist and commercial one" It helps us "to become intimate with God, with the fragile simplicity of a small new-born, with the meekness of his being laid down, with the tender affection of the swaddling clothes that surround him".

The Pope invites us to rediscover the surprise and amazement of littleness through the nativity scene, "the littleness of God, who makes himself small, who is not born in the splendour of appearances, but in the poverty of a stable".

# A prayer at the Crib Lord, we ask you bless this Crib and all who look upon it. You came to us as a helpless child to share our vulnerabilities,

As we look upon this Crib, space of tenderness, may it open our hearts and our homes to become Bethlehem spaces, open to receive the Light and Love of God and share it with others.

May this Crib which was a home for an anxious couple in search of shelter, and for a new-born child fragile and vulnerable, remind us to open our hearts and homes: to listen for the whisper of God; to listen for the voices of the anxious and the vulnerable in our families and communities this Christmas.

Gracious God, bless us with an extravagance of patience, insight, hope and love, as we await the birth of our Saviour. Pour down your blessings on all our families and homes and on the broken parts of your world.

May we know the peace that the angels announced to the shepherds and may the joy of God's coming among us in Jesus, fill our hearts
